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**Question:** What do we know about the concept of allyship in the context of LGBTQIA2S+ groups in health care/health settings in North America, Australia, and the United Kingdom?

### **PCC**

#### **Population: LGBTQ2S+ groups**

We will consider studies that include lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, two-spirit and other (LGBTQ2S+) groups.

#### **Concept: Allyship**

Allyship refers to activism on the part of heterosexual-identifying individuals within healthcare and health settings to redress health inequities and discrimination experienced by people who do not identify as heterosexual.

#### **Context: Healthcare and health settings in countries where English is the primary language**

Literature specific to healthcare (e.g., delivery) and health settings (e.g., acute, community, urban, rural) in relation to LGBTQ2S+ groups in North America, Australia and the United Kingdom will be included. Literature that is situated outside the stated geographical areas will be excluded due to recognition of allyship as an English neologism that is infrequently observed outside of countries where English is the primarily spoken native language.

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
