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Title: Defining and characterizing the role of the liaison in supporting 2SLGBTQIA+ people to navigate health-service settings: A scoping review protocol

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Question: What is known about the role of liaisons who support 2SLGBTQIA+ individuals seeking and/or receiving care in health care settings?

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Population: People who identify as 2SLGBTQIA+

We will consider studies that include individuals who identify as two-spirit, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, intersex, asexual and other (2SLGBTQIA+) groups that receive liaison support in healthcare settings.

Concept: 2SLGBTQIA+ Liaison Role

The liaison role occurs in a myriad of healthcare positions and can be represented by vast terminology. Liaison roles can be recognized by their common aim of providing service and enhancing care for people as they engage with the healthcare system. Thus, this review aims to characterize the liaison position specific to supporting 2SLGBTQIA+ people.

Context: Healthcare and health settings from a global perspective

This review will look at literature from any healthcare setting with no geographic limiters to explore global understandings of the liaison role.
